

## Pullorum Papers Required for all non-Waterfowl at Check-In

Papers to Bring

**Market Chickens and Turkeys:** Bring the hatchery papers you received at chick pickup.  
**Production and Fancy Poultry:** Two ways to meet Pullorum requirements: 1) Hatchery papers are valid for 1 year, 2) Pullorum test within the last 90 days

Get Tested

**Chickens/Other fowl:** Testing offered September 9<sup>th</sup> 9AM-12PM at poultry barn at fair. \$2/bird.  
**Heritage turkeys** older than 1 year: Tests must be performed by a veterinarian or OPA. Call the Extension office for a list of local vets.

Important Note: **Ducks and Geese do NOT need a Pullorum certificate.** Questions about Pullorum Testing? Contact Pam Rice at 614-284-0715.

### Check-in Info!

- Poultry barn is caddy-corner from the new Ag Building, the old dairy barn
- Check-in 4-10PM Friday ONLY!
- At check-in, pull up in front of the barn, unload your poultry, park your vehicle in the lot, and walk back to check in. Do NOT park at the barn please!
- An adult must be available to sign a cage liability release.
- All birds must be banded. Bands provided at check-in for \$1/band.

### JOIN OUR BAND FOR ALL FAIR COMMUNICATIONS!

Visit your device’s app store and download Band, then search for Delaware Oh 4H Poultry. Band will be used instead of FB for all fair events and updates.

### Required Daily Fair Care

All birds must have a clean, consistently available source of water. Water may need refreshed several times a day.

Birds should have consistently dry bedding refreshed daily.

Exhibitors should enlist a trusted Jr. Fair friend if they need help meeting this commitment.

#### Water Guidelines and Tips

The committee has plastic cups that can be used by standard fancy birds and bantams as waterers.

All other poultry will require you to provide a waterer. All waterers MUST be securely affixed to the cage to reduce mess.

**Turkeys, Ducks, and Market Chickens REQUIRE a minimum ONE GALLON waterer.** Milk jugs and coffee cans work great here. With zip ties to reduce spillage.

#### Bedding Guidelines and Tips

All exhibitors must provide their own bedding. It is for sale on the fairgrounds if needed.

Mandatory: No cedar bedding.

Mandatory: Cages must be cleaned daily to control barn smells.

Turkeys, geese, and ducks: The cage flooring is dirt, so you will want to provide plenty of bedding to keep your birds clean.

### Dress Code

All exhibitors must adhere to the following dress code for the show and in the sale ring:

A button/snap collared shirt closed to within one button from the top or Department approved shirt, long or short sleeves permitted.

No sleeveless shirts. No bare midriffs. No logos/ads on shirts other than 4-H or FFA.

Long pants or skirts whose length is below the knees shall be worn, no shorts.

Footwear should be sturdy shoes or boots. No sandals, open toed or open heel shoes.

Clothes must be neat in appearance with no holes, rips or tears.

### Minimum Market Bird Weights

Chickens – 14lb pen

Turkeys – 20lb bird

Ducks – 5lb bird

Underweight pens will show, but are ineligible for the auction.

		3:30pm - 5pm	<b>NEW THIS YEAR! Poultry Kids Fun Show!</b> Open to children up to age 8 (not yet in 4H) to participate in age-appropriate poultry activities. No sign-up required.
Mon	9/16	Noon	If you have multiple market animals – you must notify the committee in the barn which animals you are or aren't selling at auction. You are only permitted to sell one project.
Tues	9/17	6:00pm	<b>Market auction.</b> Line-up times TBD. Sale Order: Baked Goods, Dairy Products, Rabbits, Poultry, and Beef
Wed	9/18	8am	Processor loading. Assistance is needed to load the turkeys.
		4PM - 6PM	<b>Poultry check-out and barn tear-down.</b> Bring carriers for your birds. If you have a conflict (for instance, the pig/lamb auction), please let the Committee know who will be retrieving your birds for you. <i>Note: Committee members will move birds that have not been checked out by 6PM in order to facilitate the cage tear-down.</i>
