Selection

- Select Market Dairy Feeders that:
 - o Ayrshire, Brown Swiss, Guernsey, Holstein, or Jersey Steer
 - Look healthy
 - Sound feet and legs- walk naturally
 - Long bodied
 - Have a straight top line (back)
 - Deep, muscular bulging quarter (back leg)
 - Are wide and thick across the top of the back
 - Deep bodied and clean front end (neck area)
 - o Bold spring of rib
- Market Dairy Feeders should have been born February-April of the current year

Weight

- Ideal market weight is about 500 lbs-Delaware County Fair has a range limit of 350-700 lbs
- A normal rate of gain is 2.2-2.8 lbs of gain per day- average daily gain =2.2-2.8 lbs/day
- Market dairy feeder should weigh around 300 lbs the first week of July at to reach ideal weight for fair

Nutrition

- Young Market Dairy Feeders will need to be on milk replacer until they are 6 weeks old
- Market Dairy Feeders need 2-4 lbs of hay per day
- Market Dairy Feeder can eat 5-15 lbs of feed per day
- Market Dairy Feeders should eat between a 12-18% protein feed
- Clean/ fresh water access

Health

- A normal body temperature for Market Dairy Feeder is 100.4°F-102.8°F
- Common health concerns to look for: scours, umbilical hernia, acidosisovereating, and bloat
- Market Dairy Feeders that do not feel well will stand by themselves, not eat,

not stand and move, as well as other symptoms

 It's very important to observe your animal's normal behavior every day so you can notice abnormal behavior.



Facilities and Equipment

- Good ventilation
- Space- 25-30 square feet per animal recommended
- Gate should be strong and 4 ft. or more in height
- Grooming chute
- Rope halter- 1 per animal
- Show halter- 1 per animal

Dates you need to look for

- Quality Assurance (or test out)-July 1
 - Market animal exhibitors by law must attend
- Animal must be in possession of the exhibitor by July 1
- A picture ID card must be turned in by July 7

- Neck rope 1 per animal
- Show Stick
- Feed pan
- Water tub
- Blower
- Scotch comb
- Curry comb
- Grooming clipper
- Mandatory tag-in is mid-August on a Saturday
- Entry deadline is the last Friday in August
- Mandatory project book and interview is the second Saturday in September

- Delaware County Fair- next year
 - o This Dairy Feeder can be kept and shown next year as a Dairy Steer
- Ohio State Fair- End of July
 - o Entries due June 21
 - Must have attended a Quality Assurance by June 1
