Dear Market Lamb 4-H exhibitors and 4-H advisors,

As you begin your projects for this year, please find enclosed some important fair rules for market lamb exhibitors. Included is information that will be helpful for exhibitors at the Delaware County Fair (DCF), Ohio State Fair, and the Hartford Independent Fair. A more complete listing of rules for each fair will be available in each fair's exhibitor handbook once it is published.

Please note the Delaware County Fair market lamb identification will be online like last year. Having an approved Scrapie ID is mandatory for all market lambs. You **must use the full-length scrapie ID** on your "tagging" form. Hartford tags will not be accepted as your ID. This identification is mandatory for Delaware County Fair participation. Each exhibitor can ID up to 4 lambs but only show 2 at the fair. Use this link or the QR code to identify your market lambs by **June 7**: <https://go.osu.edu/dellambid>. \*The process is updated this year. You will be identifying your animals within the FairEntry system. See included instructions for help. When you register for the Delaware County Fair in August, your animals will already be in the system. Family identification will still be honored at entry time. Late ID forms are accepted for one week with a \$50 late fee per exhibitor.



Quality assurance is mandatory for market lamb projects. Email Jacci [Smith.11005@osu.edu](mailto:Smith.11005@osu.edu) for questions.

Please note that this year the Ohio State Fair possession date for market lambs is May 23.

NEW THIS YEAR- for Delaware County Fair-

- The show will start at **3pm on Sunday** of the fair. Delaware County Fair schedule has some slight modifications. Please check <https://go.osu.edu/jrfairschedule> for updates.
- There will be 4 showmanship classes- beg. (8-9) Jr. (10-11) int. (12-14) Sr. (15-18)
- There will be a **max weight of 155** for champion and Jr. Fair Sale eligibility

DCF exhibitors are responsible for cleaning out their pens. Since a second show moves in after-sale night pens need to be cleaned by Thursday morning. The penalty is a \$25 per pen fee.

Like last year, the sale committee is planning to continue having youth digitally submit a picture of themselves and their project before coming to the fair for the sale.

## Market Lamb Exhibit Information

All Market lambs regardless of their age will be required to have an approved Scrapie ID. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to make sure the animal has proper identification prior to exhibition at the fair. **When you buy sheep, they should have a scrapie ID from the breeder. Check to make sure they do!**

### For Delaware County Fair Market Lamb Exhibitors

- **A more complete listing of rules will be available in the exhibitor handbook once it is published.**
- All 4-H and FFA members who wish to exhibit market lambs at the county fair must have their animals in their possession by **June 1<sup>st</sup>**.
- **All sheep exhibiting at the fair must have an approved form of scrapie identification.**
- Market lambs must be identified by submitting pictures and their official scrapie identification number online by **June 7** in order to exhibit at the Delaware County Fair. A member may identify up to 4 market lambs to be tagged. Late identification is accepted for one week with a \$50/ exhibitor late fee.
- Members may identify to 4 lambs. Exhibitors may enter and bring up to 2 lambs to the county fair.
- Junior Fair exhibitors may enter and exhibit a market project in up to 2 departments if they meet the conditions outlined by the Fair Board. Please see the "Fair General Rules" section of the Exhibitors handbook posted on the Delaware County Fair's website ([www.delawarecountyfair.com](http://www.delawarecountyfair.com)).
- Interview judging for Market Lamb exhibitors will be held Saturday, **September 7** from 9:30 AM – 1:30 PM at the Delaware County Fairgrounds. Members should bring their project books completed up to that date. Livestock exhibitors who are unable to be interviewed on that date should schedule an interview with your advisor.
- In addition to traditional black-faced club lamb classes, a class specifically dedicated to white-faced crossbreeds will be offered
- All market lamb exhibitors must attend a Quality Assurance program by **July 1**.
- Members must complete a fair entry form to exhibit at the county fair. Junior fair entries are due by Friday, **August 23** online.
- Market lambs must be sheared to the hide (slick sheared ¼" or less) at weigh in. Shearers will not be available at the fairgrounds. Check with your advisor if you need assistance finding a shearer.
- Champion and Reserve Champion market lambs are not eligible for Pen of Two market lambs. Champion and Reserve champion exhibitors are eligible to show for the remaining top 5 overall market lambs with their second lamb.
- Pen of two champion and reserve champion will sell through the Jr. Fair Sale. Each exhibitor will sell the pen of two as a lot not as 2 separate sheep.
- The Champion and Reserve champion individual lambs as well as the Champion and Reserve champion pen of 2 lambs will all be harvested after the sale at facilities that are determined by the sale committee.
- Market lambs must weigh between **95-155 pounds to show for champion and go through the Jr. Fair Sale.**
- All exhibitors and parents agree to sign a form that they understand the rules prior to fair weigh in.

- The Senior Fair Board shall have the right to examine or test an animal for any illegal substance that changes the conformation or temperament of the animal. Exhibitors who may be found in violation of this rule may face forfeiture of any and all premiums from that year's fair and potential banishment from that and future fairs as well as disciplinary action as the Senior Fair Board may deem to be appropriate.
- If any problems arise from the packer with a project animal, the exhibitor will be held financially responsible.
- Only animals entered at the Delaware County Fair will be permitted on the fairgrounds.
- The show will begin at **3pm on Sunday** of the fair.
- Exhibitors are responsible to ensure their pens are cleaned out by Thursday morning. There will be a \$25 per pen penalty fee for those that are left uncleaned.
- Exhibitors selling through the Junior Fair Auctions will not be permitted to take that project home.
- Show ring attire requirements are a collared shirt with no logo and not sleeveless, long pants without rips or tears.
- Fans less than 100 watts will be permitted
- Tents, chairs, stands, and other fitting equipment should not be placed any closer than 10' within any barn. Tents in violation will be removed by the show committee as appropriate.
- Animal exhibitors will be asked to acknowledge that they are willingly placing their animals in the Delaware County Fair's stall/pen/cage.

### **For Ohio State Fair Market Lamb Exhibitors**

- Possession date is May 23

### **For Hartford Fair Market Lamb Exhibitors**

- May exhibit up to 5 animals (one Pen of 2 and three singles)
- Market lambs cannot be shown in the breeding sheep show at Hartford Fair
- Possession deadline: May 1
- Tagging on May 4 from 9 AM until noon at the fairgrounds. Up to 6 lambs may be tagged at that time (Fee: \$3/animal)
  - Must **COMPLETE ONLINE PRE-REGISTRATION**. The registration can be found online at <https://go.osu.edu/HartfordMarketLamb2024>
- Scrapie Identification is required
- No rams allowed.
- Animals must be slick shorn one week or less prior to the fair.
- All lambs must weigh a minimum of 95 pounds (except Southdown and Cheviots which must weigh 85 pounds).
- Exhibitors must attend a Quality Assurance Program prior to June 1
- Fair entry deadline: June 28

## 2024 DELAWARE COUNTY JUNIOR FAIR SALES/AUCTION

1. 4-H members taking a market animal to show and sell at the fair will be required to take a picture with their animal and upload it by 11:59pm, Saturday, September 7, 2024 (*links and information will be sent out with fair sign-up information*). Each species requires a submission. Photo requirements must follow sales & show arena rules:
  - The animal should be clean and groomed for show and the exhibitor should be dressed neatly as well.
  - A button/ snap collared shirt closed to within one button from the top or Department approved shirt (such as a lab coat), long or short sleeves permitted.
    - No sleeveless shirts allowed.
    - No bare midriffs allowed.
    - No logos/ads on shirts other than 4-H or FFA.
  - Long pants or skirts whose length is below the knee shall be worn, no shorts.
  - Footwear should be sturdy shoes or boots.
    - No sandals, open toed or open heel shoes.
  - Clothes must be neat in appearance with no rips or tears.

Please plan a plain/solid background with little distractions/clutter. (ex: building wall, pine tree, etc.)

These pictures will be printed and given to the buyers during the auctions, so please plan to take a great picture as a thank you to your buyer.

2. Junior Fair exhibitors may enter and exhibit a market project in up to 2 departments if they meet the conditions outlined by the Fair Board.
  - **Exhibitors will still only be allowed to sell ONE market project through the sale.** Please see the “Fair General Rules” of the Exhibitors handbook posted on the Delaware County Fair’s website ([www.delawarecountyfair.com](http://www.delawarecountyfair.com))
3. W-9 forms will be required from all market exhibitors. These forms are to be filled out and turned into the fair office by December 31st. Sale checks will be mailed when available to those who have turned in their W-9 forms. Exhibitors who sell in the Jr. Fair Sale with gross proceeds greater than or equal to \$600 will receive a 1099 tax form from the fair.
4. The sale order is established by having the species that sold last in the previous year sell first in the current year.
  - The sale order for the 2024 Tuesday sale shall be Baked Goods, Dairy Products, Rabbits, Poultry, and Beef.
  - The sale order for the 2024 Wednesday sale will be: Goats, Lambs, and Pigs.
5. Delaware County Fair has a Buyers Club to help support the sales. The purpose of the Buyers Club is to provide an opportunity to participate in the sale for those businesses, organizations, or individuals who are interested in contributing to a pool of resources or unable to attend the sale. The committee that oversees the Buyers Club is seeking additional members. Anyone interested in participating on this committee should contact Cheryl Hagerty at 614-595-1562.
6. All exhibitors selling a market animal or product through the Junior Fair Sales at the Delaware County Fair must submit a thank you note, card or letter to the Junior Fair Office (drop box), located on the fairgrounds, by October 31. The envelope should be sealed with a stamp affixed and the exhibitor’s name listed with the return address. Thank you notes and tokens of appreciation given to buyer’s at the sale do not count toward this requirement.

## Delaware County Fair Animal Identification for Exhibitors

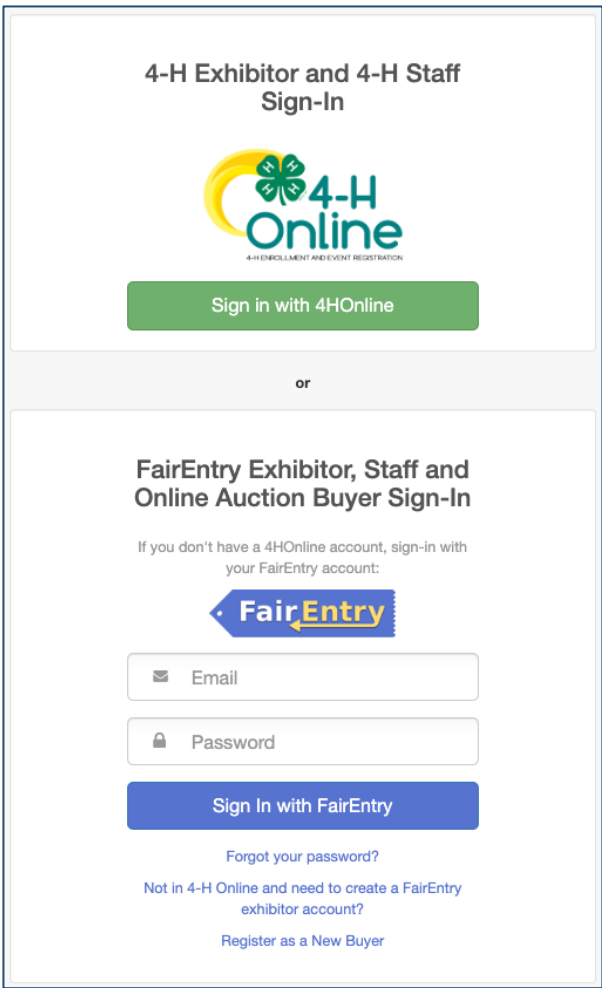
**Animal ID does NOT register you or create entries into your fair.**

Adding animals using the Animal ID process makes those animals available to be selected during the registration and entry process for the fair. Animal ID dates end before the entry dates begin.

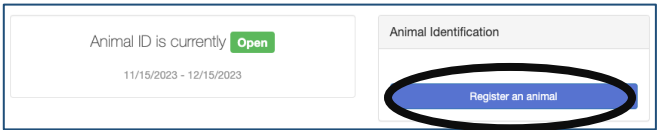
**June 7<sup>th</sup> is the deadline and the following process must be used for Market Hogs, Market Lambs, Market Goats, Alpacas, and Dogs. Other Animals should refer to their letter for specific ID requirements.**

### Steps

1. Login to Delaware County Junior Fair using your 4-H Online account with the GREEN button
  - NOTE: in order to use the 4-H Online login account, you must be a fully approved active member in 4-H Online for the current year.
  - If you are a member of both 4-H and FFA, use the GREEN button.
2. If you are an FFA member only needing to identify animals for the fair use the blue button.
  - This option should only be used if you are exhibiting this animal through your FFA chapter.
  - If you do not already have an account in FairEntry, create a new account using the “Not in 4-H Online and need to create a FairEntry exhibitor account?” link.



3. When you have logged in, you will see the dates that Animal ID is open.
4. Click on the blue “Register an animal” button.



5. Select "Register an Exhibitor" to add information about the person who will be exhibiting the animal. Then click "Individual"
6. If you used your 4-H Online account you should see the option to select an existing exhibitor.
  - Note: Please do not create two separate exhibitor accounts for the same person, even if you are enrolled in both 4-H and FFA. There should only be one exhibitor account for each person.
  - FFA-only FairEntry account users- use the "Create an Exhibitor from Scratch" option.
  - Enter all exhibitor information.
  - Click Continue when finished.

9. When you reach the Review step, and all information is correct, click Continue to Animals.

10. Select the Animal Type from the drop-down menu, then fill out all fields as requested. Fields marked with an asterisk are required. Click Finish.

11. The next screen will be the file uploads for that animal type.

12. Continue to add animals for this exhibitor by using the Add an Animal button. Notice that you can delete or edit animal information if you need to do that.

13. **When you are done with all the animals for this exhibitor**, click on the green Exhibitors tab at the top of the screen to add another exhibitor and their animals.

14. **When you are done with all animals for all exhibitors in this family**, use the green Finished button to exit the process and return to the original screen.



*Tips*

- Be sure to use the same login for Animal ID as you use for creating entries for your fair. The animals identified will only be available to exhibitors using this same login.
- **Animal sharing within a login group will be allowed for Market hogs, Market lambs, and Market goats.** You can add an animal through one exhibitor, and it will be available to be selected for an entry for any exhibitor that is a part of the same exhibitor group.
- While Animal ID is “Open” for your fair in FairEntry, you can login again to add more animals to your account, if you have more that need added after you log out the first time. (Note: Animal ID dates and entry dates cannot overlap, so when you log in, you will EITHER be able to identify animals, OR make entries into the fair.)

#### In person Quality Assurance Test

Email or call to schedule a convenient time for you! **No tests will be administered after July 1<sup>st</sup>**. The Quality Assurance test is offered for youth 4-H ages 12 years and older who have previously completed Quality Assurance programming. Participants must pass by at least 70%. Participants can receive QA credit for multiple years, depending on their age. The test may be taken once each year, any participants who do not pass will be required to complete a Quality Assurance program to receive QA credit.

## Quality Assurance 2024 - Frequently Asked Questions

- **Who must attend Quality Assurance?** All 4-H and FFA members taking **Market Beef, Market Swine, Market Lambs, Breeding sheep, Market and Breeding Rabbits, All Poultry, Goats (including Pygmy and Pack goats) and Dairy Cattle** **MUST** attend a Quality Assurance program in order to exhibit at the Delaware County or Ohio State Fair. Completing the quality assurance requirement **each year** is mandatory by state law for junior exhibitors.
- **When is the Quality Assurance attendance deadline?** For the Delaware County Fair this deadline is on or before **July 1**. Hartford Fair deadline is on or before **June 1**. For Ohio State Fair this deadline is **June 1**. Ohio Department of Agriculture requires exhibitors to have participated or tested out of a Quality Assurance program within 45 day prior to the opening day of the exhibition.
- **Does it matter which Quality Assurance I attend?** There are 5 QA programs offered in Delaware County this year. Credit will be given for QA attendance regardless of which program you attend.
- **What if I arrive at a Quality Assurance program late?** It is important for each 4-H or FFA member to receive all the training in order to meet Ohio Department of Agriculture requirements. **Anyone arriving more than 10 minutes late will not receive credit for attending the QA session.** For the virtual sessions we will have a moderator letting individuals in from a waiting room. Attendance will be taken via the chat feature at the beginning and the end of the session. If you experience technical difficulties during the session email Jacci at [smith.11005@osu.edu](mailto:smith.11005@osu.edu).
- **What happens if I am unable to attend any of the Delaware County Quality Assurance programs?** If you have a conflict with each of the listed Quality Assurance options on the reverse of this sheet, you may contact other county offices to see if you can participate at their offerings. If you know you will have conflicts with the Delaware County dates, call as soon as possible because many counties have earlier QA dates. **Also, an asynchronous online session can be taken. YQCA online version is the only type of online QA accepted in the state of Ohio.** Information on how to complete this can be found on our website- <https://delaware.osu.edu/program-areas/4-h-youth-development/quality-assurance>
- **What about the Hartford Fair?** Exhibitors at the Hartford fair taking **any** market or breeding projects must attend a Quality Assurance program on or before **June 1**. Call the Licking Co. Extension office with questions. **The QA session on June 3 is after the deadline for the Hartford Fair and will not meet the requirement for exhibitors.**
- **Can I Test Out of Quality Assurance?** Yes! Delaware County offers in person opportunities for youth to test out of their Quality Assurance. Youth ages 12 and above may take a Quality Assurance test to see how well they know the material. Youth passing the test may potentially fulfill their QA requirement for multiple years, depending on their age. Email Jacci at [smith.11005@osu.edu](mailto:smith.11005@osu.edu) or call the Extension office to schedule a time to take the test or if you have additional questions (740-833-2039). **Tests will NOT be scheduled after July 1<sup>st</sup>!** You can now also take the YQCA online test out option.
