What is Still Exhibit Summer Judging?

This judging is for those that want to represent Delaware County at the Ohio State Fair in their project, because our county fair judging takes place after the state fair. Still Exhibit Summer Judging is **Thursday, July 21, 2022 at the Delaware County Fairgrounds.**

Should I attend Summer Judging or get judged the closer to Delaware County Fair?

If you are interested in competition at the state level, you should attend Summer Judging. Ohio State Fair representatives are determined that day. The competitive judging for Delaware County Junior Fair is Saturday, September 10th. You will need to attend both judging events if you want to be competitive for both state and county fair.

How to I register?

Sign up for a specific time for your project through Sign Up Genius. Sign up is open July 1st to July 18th. Time slots start every 10 minutes from 9:30 AM to 11:30 AM. Plan on about 45 minutes for judging.

1. Arts, Photography, Cake Decorating, Related Home Economics, Leadership, Communication, & Companion Animal Projects

Use of any technique listed in a higher skill level means you will be judged at that higher skill level. See your project record book to reference techniques and skill level.)

Family Life, Health, Home Decorating, Money Management - Babysitting (Idea Starter), Family History Treasure Hunt, Staying Healthy, The Truth about Tobacco, Alcohol and Drug Abuse, Superhero You, Keeping Fit, First Aid in Action, Medicine Science and Safety, Tracking Your Health & Fitness, Your Thoughts Matter, You're The Athlete, It's My Home, Makeover My Space, Your First Home Away from Home, Laundry, *Becoming Money Wise, *On the Road to Financial Success, Canning & Freezing, Self-Determined Family Life

*These projects do not have a State Fair opportunity. Judging is offered as a make-up for fair judging.

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Tips and Guidelines for Judging Day

- Arrive about 10 minutes prior to your judging time to register. If you do not pre-register online, we will work you in as we can.
- Please allow at least 30 minutes to complete the judging process.
- State Fair Winners will be posted to the web at <http://delaware.osu.edu/program-areas/4-h-youth-development/summer-judging> as soon as we can that afternoon. There will be an awards presentation (after Style Revue) to pass out state fair paperwork at about **6:15 PM, Thursday, July 21 at the Delaware County Fairgrounds.**
- In order to receive a fair grade exhibit premium, members **MUST** exhibit their project at the Delaware County Fair. You must drop off the exhibit at the Junior Fair Building during judging on September 10th, OR between 6-9 PM, Wednesday or Thursday prior to fair OR between 1-8 PM, Friday prior to fair. These projects will only receive grade premium and cannot be considered for Delaware County Fair trophy awards unless they are re-interviewed Saturday, September 10th.
- Remember to bring your project book and your item or exhibit to judging.
